

# FODDER RADISH

## SAMURAI

### OVERVIEW

This Japanese radish is very similar to Nooitgedacht but it has a greater uniformity. This variety was bred by the ARC - Field and Pasture Institute at Cedara in South Africa.

The bulbs of this species are large, cylindrical and very prominent. The recommended planting density for SAMURAI is 1.8- 2kg/ha dryland and 3kg/ha under irrigation.

For optimal production SAMURAI should be planted in rows that are spaced 30-45cm apart at a depth of 10mm. SAMURAI can be sown from late January to late February in most areas.

- SAMURAI is an excellent rotation crop especially for maize
- SAMURAI can be used from 3 months after sowing
- Can be sown from late January till end February
- Produces food mid-winter when you need it most
